### Our Story

North Jersey Friendship House was established in 1964 by the Teaneck Chapter of the National Council of Jewish Women. Friendship House began as a storefront operation staffed by dedicated volunteers and continues to serve individuals with varying abilities. With headquarters in Hackensack, New Jersey, North Jersey Friendship House has grown into a multifaceted organization serving annually over 500 individuals with programming space in Hackensack, Paramus, Wayne and Washington Township, staffed by over 100 professionals.

### Our Year

We spent this full-year fighting COVID-19. With testing in place every two to three weeks, we kept our staff and members safe. We offered hybrid services and pivoted to remote services in January 2021. By the time of the fiscal year-end, we were back to in-person services.

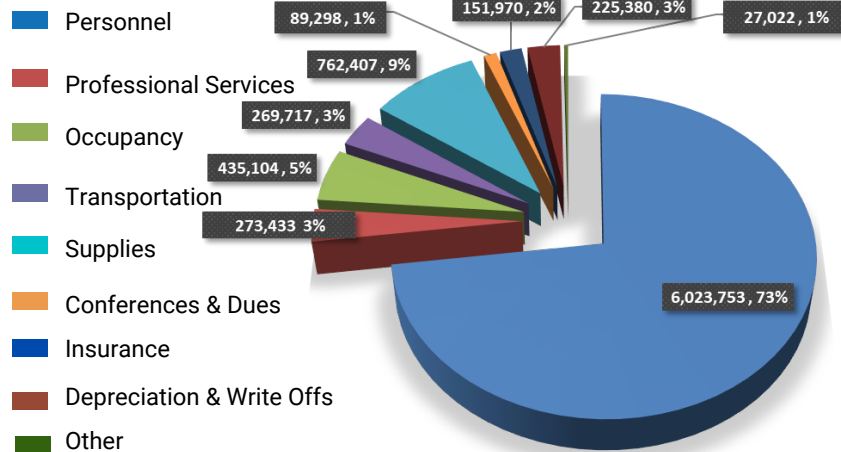

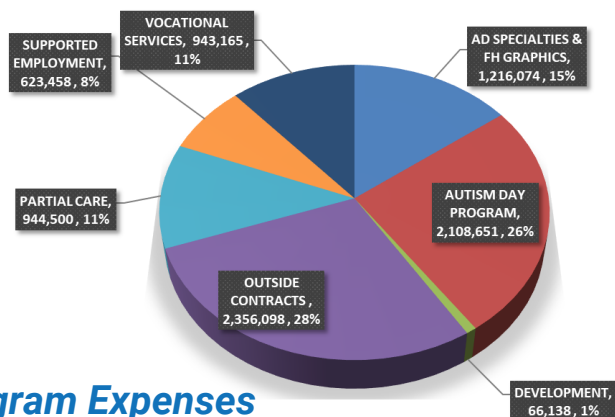
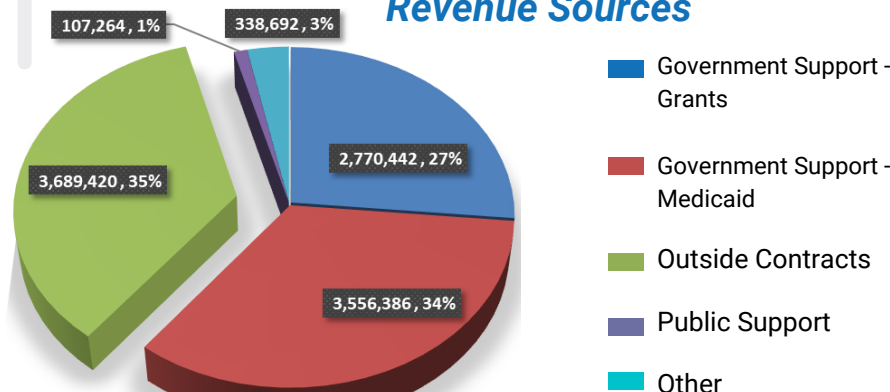
